#### What is this medicine?

LABETALOL (la BET a lole) is a beta-blocker. Beta-blockers reduce the workload on the heart and help it to beat more regularly. This medicine is used to treat high blood pressure.

This medicine may be used for other purposes; ask your health care provider or pharmacist if you have questions.

## How should I use this medicine?

Take this medicine by mouth with a glass of water. Follow the directions on the prescription label. Take your doses at regular intervals. Do not take your medicine more often than directed. Do not stop taking this medicine suddenly. This could lead to serious heart-related effects.\n\nTalk to your pediatrician regarding the use of this medicine in children. Special care may be

Overdosage: If you think you have taken too much of this medicine contact a poison control center or emergency room at once.\nNOTE: This medicine is only for you. Do not share this medicine with others.

#### Where should I keep my medicine?

Keep out of the reach of children.\n\nStore at room temperature between 15 and 30 degrees C (59 and 86 degrees F). Protect from light. Keep container tightly closed. Throw away any unused medicine after the expiration date.

## What side effects may I notice from receiving this medicine?

Side effects that you should report to your doctor or health care professional as soon as possible:\n-allergic reactions like skin rash, itching or hives, swelling of the face, lips, or tongue\n-breathing problems\n-cold hands or feet\n-dark urine\n-depression\n-general ill feeling or flu-like symptoms\n-irregular heartbeat\n-light-clored stools\n-loss of appetite, nausea\n-pain or trouble passing urine\n-right upper belly pain\n-slow heart rate (fewer than recommended by your doctor or health care professional)\n-swollen legs or ankles\n-tingling of the scalp or skin\n-unusually weak or itred\n-vomiting\n-yellowing of the eyes or skin\n\n-lost ausuly do not require medical attention (report to your doctor or health care professional if they continue or are bothersome):\n-decreased sexual function or desire\n-dry itching skin\n-beadardse\n-tireqhess

## What may interact with this medicine?

This medicine also interact with the following medications:\n\n -certain medicines for blood pressure, heart disease, irregular heart beat\n -cimetidine\n -general anesthetics\n -medicines for asthma or lung disease like albutero\n -medicines for depression\n -nitroglycerin
